Desiring to create a single, coherent instrument embodying as far as possible all up-to-date standards of existing International Maritime Labour Conventions and Recommendations, as well as the fundamental principles to be found in other International Labour Convention, the General Conference of the International Labour Organization (ILO) adopts, in February of 2006, the Maritime Labour Convention, 2006.

Except as expressly provided otherwise, the MLC applies to all seafarers and to all ships whether publicly or privately owned, ordinarily engaged in commercial activities.

The course will covers the ILO – Maritime Labour Convention requirements in term of:

- Requirements for seafarers to work on a ship
- Conditions of employment
- Accommodation, recreational facilities, food and catering
- Health protection, welfare, medical care and social protection
- Compliance and enforcement

- Key factors to the development and the daily existence of the human being
- Various elements and stressors affecting the performance of the crew
- Consequences of the stressors on the personnel and crew
