INTRODUCTION TO ISM CODE

COURSE CONTENT

ISM Code, the International Safety Management Code was made mandatory through the new chapter IX of the 1994 amendments to the International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea (SOLAS).

The ISM Code in IMO resolutions, recognized the need for appropriate organization of management to enable it to respond to the need of those on board ships to achieve and maintain high standards of safety and environmental protection.

The Safety and Environmental Protection management system ashore and on board each ship must be documented and are subject to internal and external audits.

In regard to the requirements of the ISM Code, what are the responsibilities and authority of my company? What are the Master's responsibilities and authority on board the ship? How to implement and maintain the safety and environmental protection policy of the company on shore and on board each ship? How to develop safety plans for shipboard operations? How to be sure that my company management system for safety and environmental protection is performing according to the company policy? How to review the company safety management system?
